Jump to: Overview | Layers | Crop | Edit | Blur | Straighten | Enhance Overview A quick overview of the tools available in Photoshop Elements Layers The Layers panel and the List tool The Layers panel displays all the elements in a single image. Elements can be stacked on top of each other to create complex compositions. You can use the Layers panel to arrange these elements into any order that you want. The Layers panel contains two tools to work with layers. The Layers panel's Layer button opens up a sub-menu where you can view, select, edit, copy and move layers. The List tool (L) displays a list of layers and makes them selectable and editable. One unique feature is that you can also create new layers from inside the Layer panel using the New Layers icon that looks like a number (layer number) 2. However, this is not a simple case of adding a new layer as it creates a new layer on top of the currently visible layers rather than creating a new layer below those visible layers. With this type of layer, the visible layers remain unaltered. The Layers panel The Layers panel displays layers in a grid format, allowing them to be moved to different positions in the image. The Layers panel is divided into three columns: 1) The top section of the panel contains the tools to view, move, and edit each layer in the image. 2) The Layers panel's Layers menu 3) The bottom section of the panel contains the image to be edited. Luke Shaw has praised the England squad - and Phil Neville - for not letting his Tottenham teammates get ahead of themselves in the race for the Premier League title. Spurs have not won any of their last five top-flight games, even beating newly-promoted Cardiff on Saturday. But they are still on course to record a sixth straight top-four finish in the Premier League, with a game in hand over Manchester City and Liverpool and a two-point cushion over West Ham. Spurs have been outscored in those last five home matches, but their defence of the title has often been solid. The north Londoners have only conceded three times in the league this season, and defender Shaw said: "I'm proud of the side. We didn't make it easy on ourselves this time last year. "That's how our season went. We're on a high. We just need to keep going. "There are a lot of guality players but everyone has to understand that every game is a big one. You can't get over-excited. We've just got to remain grounded and try and take it game by game." Shaw made his debut for Tottenham last year and his confidence and fitness have improved considerably since making his Premier League bow against Arsenal in April. The 22-year-old said: "I'm feeling good. I feel like I'm coming into my best football now. I'm really enjoying it and I can't wait for the next game." Spurs face West Ham at White Hart Lane on Saturday and face an equally important clash with Liverpool in the Champions League a week later. Shaw added: "We have to take it game by game. We've got to get into the Champions League. It would be fantastic if we made it into the guarter-finals. "We have to take it week-by-week. The 33rd Presidency As soon as George W. Bush becomes the 41st President of the United States. the next question is: what are his priorities? As people begin to play political "what if" games, we should not underestimate how difficult the next four years are going to be for him. This period will be every bit as tumultuous as that of the Clinton presidency. While the effects of the 2000 election will be with us for a long time to come, the immediate repercussions of the 2004 election will be felt within weeks. The Obama presidency will also be very difficult. The millions who came to see W emerge as the next president and say "I-M-V-O" will not be so easy to convert to the "Obama candidacy." His appeal in the Rust Belt states will be even more difficult. He will also have to overcome the far left wing of the Democratic Party, which will use his association with Bill and Hillary Clinton to create more anti-Barack hysteria, asking the "what was he doing with my husband?" question. When it comes to politics, it is not a coincidence that Bush's father ran to the right of Reagan and the Reagan's father was to the right of his brother (the last President Johnson). It is also important to understand that the real differences between Bush and Obama are much more fundamental than who is the "liberal" on gun control, Social Security, the Wall Street bail-outs, regulations on the financial sector, the Patriot Act and so on. In every case, it is important to remember that for Bush it will be a question of what policies the U.S. can afford. The policies that are right for the country are those that help the economy recover and America's military position in the world. Bush will be more likely to accept a package of liberal policies than Obama. The problem that he will face is that such packages will encounter serious resistance from traditional conservatives, the people who are on the way to becoming a mainstream of American politics, while they are certain to be enthusiastically accepted by the far left. The other problem is the conundrum that any package of liberal policies will always face, the polarization of the country. The polarization of the country has been going on for more than 40 years, and this election is part of it. During the first two decades of the Cold War,
